Walla Walla University Policy on Summer Tuition for NPUC Teachers

To provide for the educational needs of K-12 teachers in the North Pacific Union Conference, Walla Walla University will continue to offer courses that will enhance the educational experience of teachers and/or help them earn a master's degree at Walla Walla University. Eligible teachers are not charged tuition for courses taken at Walla Walla University during the summer. The University and Union negotiate a flat fee for all NPUC teachers, adjusted annually. Teachers may, however, be responsible for additional fees and costs, such as tour costs.

Eligibility requirements:

- 1. An employee must have already earned a bachelor's degree.
- 2. An employee must be an administrator or teacher with a full-time or part-time contract in an NPUC school, grades K-12, for the *subsequent* school year.
- 3. An employee must seek approval through the local Conference educational office to apply for this program.

The following are not eligible:

- 1. Employees who have not completed a baccalaureate degree.
- 2. Teacher aides and other staff members.
- 3. Employees who do not have a contract in an NPUC school, grades K-12, for the *subsequent* school year.

Additional restrictions for approved *part-time* teaching employees:

- 1. A maximum of six credits are permitted.
- 2. Courses must contribute to the employee's professional development, as approved by the employing organization.
- 3. Enrollment is permitted on a space-available basis and does not count toward the minimum required enrollment for a class to be offered.
